Trip Coordinators' Corner:

We are on a roll with the trips for 2024 and intend to have the trips on sale June 27th at 6:30 at the Old Towne Pub for at least Big Sky and Europe and hopefully most of the other trips.

Chile has 11 people going right now for a September 5-12, 2023 trip. This trip includes four days of skiing, four meals a day at Portillo and three nights to explore Santiago with breakfasts included. You must sign up by May 1st to guarantee the price of \$3,400.

2024 Trip Planning:

The first trip is January 6th –12th to Big Sky Montana. Joe, Peggy and Eileen are the trip leaders. This is a seven day trip with five days at Big Sky. We are staying at the Huntley Lodge which is a Ski in/Ski out property. The base price (air and land only) for Big Sky is \$1,600. The 2024 lift ticket pricing should be announced in early June. The 2023 lift pricing was as follows; Adult 3-day lift tickets for last year's groups were \$597; Seniors (70+) were \$522. The five-day lift tickets were \$845 adults and \$715 for seniors. We expect a moderate increase in those rates. Our tour operator will be offering a discount on Big Sky's Flex Pass which has the lowest pricing and allows you to use your 3 or 5 days of skiing in Big Sky for any date in the 23/24 season. There will also be an opportunity to buy a full or base Ikon pass at preseason rates through the tour operator. Details to follow!

The second trip is January 18th -21st and is the Snowdrifter Midwest family ski trip. We are not sure yet where it will be but will probably be a 4 to 6 hour drive. The plan is to find a location that will offer activities for all ages (pool, etc.) and discount pricing for kids. The idea is to be able to have kids and grandkids go on this multi-generational trip. Maureen, Joe and Bre are planning.

The third trip is January 27th -February 3rd to Italy's Sellaronda region Val Di Fassa. We chose this trip because the trip this year to Paganelli was so well done. The vendors that took us around and introduced to other things in Italy such as wineries, food, tours, and history are also setting up this trip. We are looking at side excursions from the Val Di Fassa region for winery, cheese factory, WW 1 history, food and more. Also the Sellaronda is the largest skiing area in the world linking together more than a dozen ski areas in the Dolomites and has spectacular scenery. We are also working on a 4 day extension to Sicily until February 7th. Frank, Sue and John W. will be leading this trip.

We are looking at a one day get out and ski with the club locally on February 10th. The club is negotiating discount lift tickets and rentals or lessons if people would like a fun day with tailgating included. Michelle and Cathleen are planning this trip.

Another trip is Winter Park where we would take the ski train from Chicago to Winter Park then fly back. Tentative dates are February 24th - March 1st. Trip is being planned for 5 nights. Mike and Hank are the trip leaders.

We are planning a trip March 7th -12th to Big White in Canada \$1,550 plus lifts. There are 32 spots available. This trip offers ski in/out accommodations at a huge Canadian ski area. The trip leaders are Mark and Frank.

The final trip in mid-late March is for the Lake Placid Olympic Extravaganza. You will be able to ski the largest vertical in the North East, choose to ride the Olympic luge or bobsled, see the Olympic museum and working on other special Olympic events. The flights below are direct to

Burlington, VT with a short 60 mile bus ride. It will be five nights at the Grand Adirondack Hotel, billed as vibrant hub in the heart of Lake Placid. The hotel rooms are two queens to a room with a microwave, Keurig and mini-fridge. Also includes a 4 day adult lift ticket to Lake Placid.

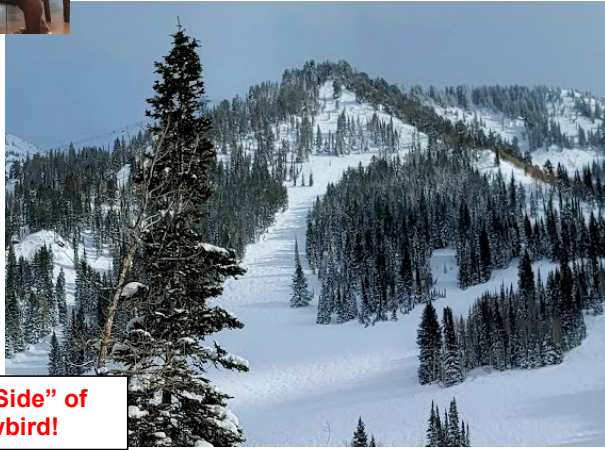

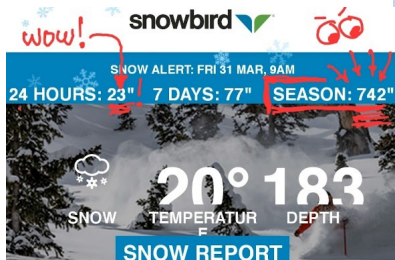
"Front Side" of Snowbird!

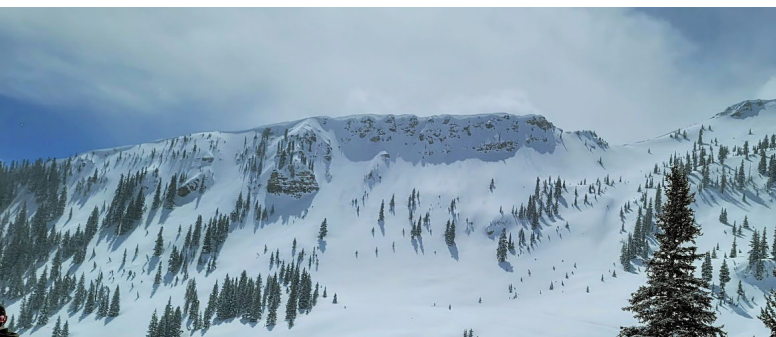


"Back Side"- Mineral Basin!

My Ski History with Fox Valley Snowdrifters

I started skiing in 1981 with a work group going to Majestic Mountain near Lake Geneva after work on an occasional Friday night. Took a couple of lessons there on rented skis with plate binding – hated those things.

About 1984 Lowell Iverson invited me to join Fox Valley Snowdrifters and I started going on some weekend bus trips. There was a strong singles group then and as I had just been divorced, it was a good fit. They were friends and family to me. We hung out together on trips and did regular TGIF bar hangouts in St. Charles and Geneva. On most trips I roomed and skied with Bob Hoffman. In those early days I spent a lot of time falling and getting up. So much so that my neck was sore, and I had to hold my head with my hands to get out of bed. Bob hung with me through it all even when he could have gotten a lot more skiing in without me.

I bought my first ski equipment package at the Sports Authority and for a little while they were good enough. I quickly found out on my first western trip to Whistler-Blackcomb in 1988 that these skis were no longer adequate, and I bought new equipment from Vertical Drop in St. Charles. I made several new equipment and apparel purchases there and was very sorry when they closed doors.

After two western trips I took a week of ski lessons at Steamboat with Lowell Iverson. A very good investment that improved my skiing immensely. Lowell had to convince me not to ski trees as he didn't want to see me get hurt on our last day. Thanks Lowell.

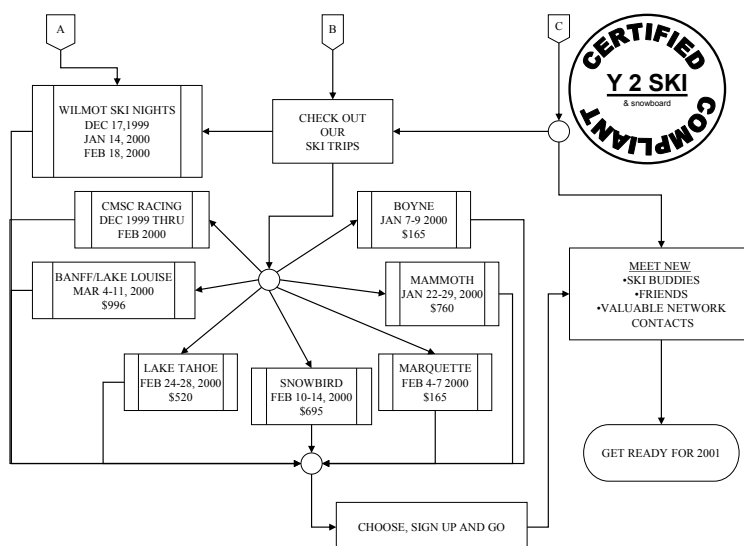
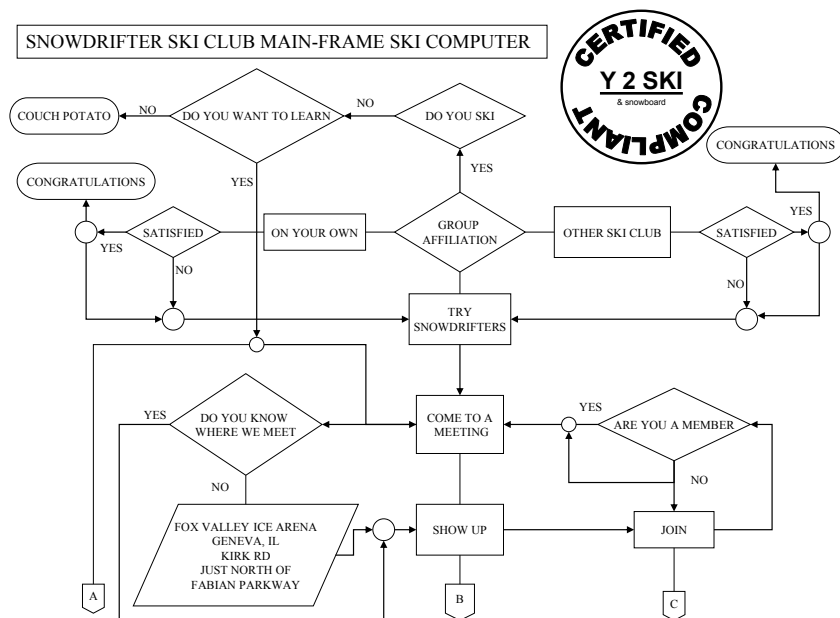
Dates are blurry but I think it was in 1990 that I became Treasurer and took the books over from Bill Pierson. I became Vice President under Joe Waldeck then President (1994-1996). I later served at various times as Treasurer, Trip Chairman and Secretary.

At that time, we became active in CMSC racing. We had a team of some 6-10 racers that would do it for fun and challenge. It made skiing at Wilmot and other small hills worthwhile. Plus, I was good enough that I took first place in the Vet C class. Then they moved me to Vet B class, and I would crash and burn without any medals. After 3-4 years it got old as we spent every weekend for nearly 3 months either on our club trips or racing. Life goes on.

In 2006 I got transferred to Decatur with Cat and couldn't participate as much. I did several Snowdrifters' trips 2006-2015, and I also tried to participate with central Illinois clubs. The Decatur ski club folded before I showed up as no one wanted to organize the trips. The Champaign, Bloomington, and Springfield clubs would only do the CMSC spring trips, and one organized by "Ski Kouncil of Illinois." They were more focused on dinner and summer activities.

In 2015, on the Copper Mountain trip, I felt that my body just didn't like this activity anymore. I've tried to exercise more to be in better shape, but my ski days are over. My last trip was on my own to Big Sky in 2021 and it beat me up. Strength, balance, coordination, stamina, recovery are just not good anymore. I love the sport so much I'm sad to admit this.

We had a couple of historians for a while but don't know what became of Bill Pott's work. I remember Jim Halley had the position once. He went to Utah for a while and now is in Florida and is an avid bicyclist.
