General Meeting Topics

In the past we have asked for volunteers to present to the members on any number of topics. We have had several of you step up and share a passion, arrange for a speaker or cover a topic of interest to members.

Two Cents from the Treasurer, Laurel Davis

I. Thanks to all for making monthly payments on your trips either by check or via Wild Apricot. This may seem pretty basic, but there have been some issues with checks I have received that have resulted in checks being rejected by the bank and delayed checks from clearing your accounts. So, I am going to review the steps related to writing a check.

There are **5 fields that must be completed for a check to be valid** and one field that is optional but can provide useful information to your Treasurer!

- 1. The Date
- 2. The Payee Name
- 3. The Numeric \$ Amount
- 4. The Written Out \$ Amount
- 5. The Signature
- 6. Optional The memo line can be used to tell me what trips you are paying for and how much should be applied to each trip.



If you make a mistake when filling out your check, for example:

- You write the wrong month (8 for August) on the Date Line (1) and correct it by writing the correct number of the month over the top (9 for September), the check will be rejected.
- If you write a "9" for September, but it looks like a "1", the check will be rejected as stale-dated (over six months old).
- If you don't sign the check on the signature line (Line 5), the check will be rejected.
- If the amounts on Line 3 and amount on Line 4 don't match, the check may be rejected or the amount on Line 4 will be accepted.

I have encountered all of these issues and more this year. If you notice and correct your own mistake, you MUST initial the item that you changed or wrote over for the check to be accepted.

II. Mailing Address for Checks

I live in Oak Brook and the Snowdrifters' PO Box is at the Batavia post office. I try to get to the post office at least once a week, but that is not always feasible. That may

cause some members to be concerned when they have mailed a check and it hasn't been applied to their outstanding invoice after a couple of weeks. I typically post the payments within 24 hours of picking up the mail.

So, I am providing my home address here and asking that you send the payments directly to me rather than to the post office box. It would be greatly appreciated.



Winter Park Resort



Winter Park Resort is a year-round resort located about a ninety minute drive from Denver, CO. The mountain opened in 1940. The resort consists of three interconnected mountain peaks which share a common lift ticket. There is skiing for all abilities, from beginner to tree skiing and moguls, and it was voted "Best Ski Resort in North America" in 2018 and 2019. There are 23 lifts, and a skiable area of 3081 acres.

For nearly 70 years, a popular way for Denver residents to arrive was by the Ski Train, which arrives right at the resort's base area. It stopped operating for a time in 2009, but it's running again, re-started in 2017 as the Winter

Park Express. For us non-Denver residents, we will board the "California Zephyr" in Naperville, which uses the same tracks as the Express out of Denver, and takes us right into Winter Park.

Lodging

The Vintage Hotel is located in the center of the Winter Park ski village. The ski resort is reached by a 5 minute ride on the free Village Cabriolet cable car. In the evenings guests can enjoy beverages at the Five Mountain Tavern, the hotel's lounge bar. A ski storage service is provided daily and free Wi-Fi is provided in all common areas.

A little Olympic history - READ THIS!!

Through the early 1900s Lake Placid drew increasing attention as a world-class destination for winter sports. Then in 1920 Lake Placid secured its first globally sanctioned event – the International Outdoor Speed Skating Championships. The success of this event put Lake Placid on the winter sports map.

The Lake Placid Club also built in 1920 the area's first ski jump, located at the current Intervales site. No one could have known at that time that simple 35-meter jump would eventually become all that the Olympic Jumping Complex is today, yet in hindsight the excitement of the first jumping competition could have been seen as a signal.



Not long thereafter, the community's leadership made the remarkable happen. With the region's reputation firmly established, Lake Placid made its bid for and was chosen to host the third ever Olympic Winter Games in 1932.

The three-tiered podium was first introduced at the 1932 Lake Placid Games, and the first gold medalist to take the podium was Lake Placid's own Jack Shea, born and raised in Lake Placid, he became a hometown hero when he won gold medals in the 500- and 1500-meter speed skating races in the 1932 Olympics. He is also the father of Jim Shea (Innsbruck 1964), and grandfather of Jim Shea Jr. (Salt Lake City 2002).

After Lake Placid wins the bid in 1974 to host the 1980 Winter Games, its sports legacy took another giant leap forward. Televised around the world, the 1980 Games gave us some of the most inspiring performances and unforgettable moments in the history of winter sports.

Not only is Lake Placid known as the location for the "Miracle on Ice" where the US Hockey team beat the Russian team but also the location of Eric Heiden winning US won gold in the 500m, 1000m, 1500m, 5000m, and 10,000m speed skating events, setting four Olympic records and one world record in the process. He became the first person to win all five speed skating events and the first of only three to win five gold medals in individual events at a single Games (Summer or Winter). To this day, Heiden remains the only athlete to win five gold medals at one Winter Games. https://lakeplacidlegacysites.com/history/


